Language Arts:

This week we'll continue our study of commonly misused words and we'll work on the second reading response for September. Your second Reading Response is due on Thursday. I hope to have all of your first responses returned to you by Wednesday so you can learn from the first one as you prepare your second.

Math:

Today we will kick the week off with a quiz! It will be on triangles: one, many, or none? and vocabulary. On Tuesday we will continue with the work we were doing with angles and using all our new information to find missing pieces.

If we have time we will start area!

Science:

Today, students will be given back their first science quiz, taken last Friday the 25th. As explained to the students, this quiz was simply a check-in, not the final weather grade for the report card. It gives an idea of what was understood and what still needs worked on. I will encourage students to take the quiz home and share with you. But now you know they have received it (aside from a few who were absent Friday and haven't taken the quiz yet.) so please ask to see it on your end as well.

This week we continue with weather as we conduct a condensation lab to learn more about dew point and relative humidity. We will also conduct a cloud lab to learn how high and low pressure systems affect weather. Later in the week we will play a Water Cycle game to learn a variety of processes that water goes through during the water cycle.
