

Language Arts:

This week we'll finish the UN Syrian Essay. Students will choose for themselves whether they will turn in their final draft on Wednesday or Thursday of this week. They'll sign up on Monday. We'll spend the beginning of the week going over a few lessons like transitions, intended audience, and formal voice. Remember, you also need to decide if you want to send your essay to the United Nations or not.

We'll also turn our attention to writing our This I Believe essays. We'll begin with topic selection on Tuesday and we'll start drafting them in class on Wednesday and Friday. Thursday will be our weekly study of types of sentences and the rules for commas.
